We have received your (undated) Joint Statement Regarding the Wet'suwet'en Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) letter. We thank you for bringing forward concerns regarding the internal communications regarding the MOU and the proposed trilateral MOU signing on May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

We would like to invite you to participate in a virtual meeting the week of May 4<sup>th</sup> to have further dialogue on the proposed MOU. We would like to continue building on the good work that took place in February 2020 with the community-based dialogue sessions that occurred before the COVID19 pandemic and public health crisis. We have had a number of clan meetings, across the territory, in Prince George and in Vancouver, and most recently, in virtual formats, to discuss the proposed MOU.

We would like to take some time to explore how we will work together, in our ancestral Wet'suwet'en homelands and communities.
