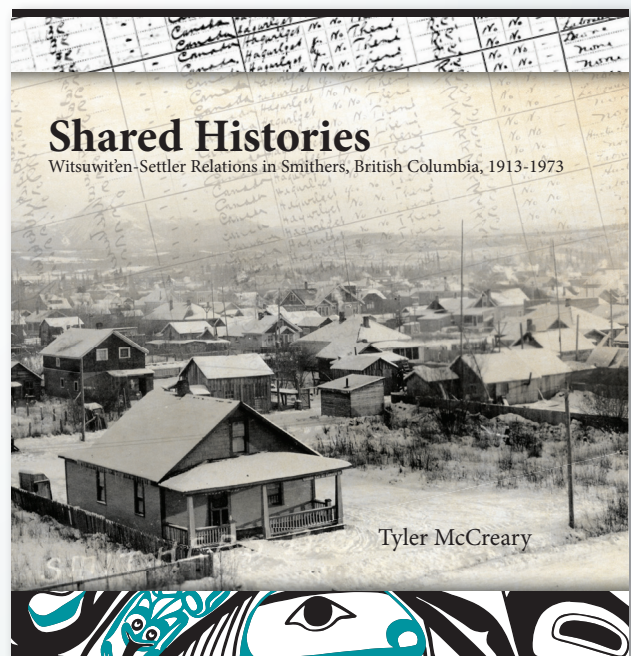

ABOUT THE BOOK

When Smithers was founded in 1913, a primarily Witsuwit'en Indigenous community known as Indiantown developed at its fringes. Indiantown was a vital node of Witsuwit'en life in Smithers for more than half a century, until development pressures eventually led to its destruction. Using archival and oral history sources, *Shared Histories* documents Witsuwit'en-settler relations in Smithers from 1913 to 1973. It is written by Tyler McCreary and published by Creekstone Press.
