The Enbridge Gateway Project Community Summit

The purpose of the All Nations Energy Summit is to bring together First Nations and non-First Nations communities, potentially affected by the proposed Enbridge Northern Gateway Pipelines, to share information on potential impacts of the pipelines, issues around the tanker moratorium, tar sands expansion, and alternative energy solutions for Northern BC.

The theme for the Summit is to *inform and inspire*:

- **INFORM:** To inform First Nations and non-First Nations communities on the environmental, cultural, socio-economic, legal, and cumulative impacts of the proposed Enbridge Northern Gateway Pipelines (including the associated tanker traffic and tar sands expansion).
- **INSPIRE:** To inspire First Nations to assert our rights and title, to build unity among our nations, and to collaborate with non-First Nations communities to protect Northern ecosystems and build sustainable energy solutions.
